

## SEPTEMBER RULES QUIZ

1. A player accidentally moves her ball on the putting green. She should replace the ball and add one penalty stroke?
  
2. Is a player allowed to clean her ball when taking relief from Ground Under Repair?
  
3. The “reference” measuring point for taking relief from a cart path is..
  - a. Point where the ball originally lay
  - b. Point where the ball crossed over the margin of the cart path
  - c. The Nearest Point of Complete Relief.
  
4. The size of a “club length” is determined by the length of the club you choose to measure with?
  
5. When taking free relief from an Abnormal Ground condition (immovable obstruction, ground under repair) a player must find their Nearest Point of Complete Relief and drop a ball.....
  - a. Within two club lengths
  - b. Within one club length
  
6. When taking relief from a cart path, a player can choose which side of the path they want to drop their ball?

7. A player's ball comes to rest against a rake the correct procedure is to...
- Drop a ball one club length of where the ball lay.
  - Move the rake. If the ball moves replace it and add one penalty stroke.
  - Move the rake. If the ball moves replace the ball where it originally lay without penalty.
8. A player may take free relief when their ball is embedded in a bunker?

### **ANSWERS**

1. False. She may replace her ball without penalty.
2. Yes.
3. c. The Nearest Point of Complete Relief, that means your feet as well.
4. False. Since 2019 it is now determined by the longest club in your bag that is not a putter.
5. b. Within one club length.
6. No, No. A player must go to their Nearest Point of Complete Relief, even if it is a bad spot!
7. c. It was not your fault the rake was there!
8. No, they may not. A player may only take free relief when their ball is embedded in the General Area, NOT allowed in bunkers or penalty areas.
